Amanda Fretwell, Reporter:

Teen Date Violence is controlling or abusive behavior in a teen dating relationship. Many young girls experience it, not knowing how to identify it or how to get help. First one must find out if they're in an abusive relationship. Ask yourself questions about your significant other: do they threaten you? Are they jealous? Do they check up on you constantly? Do they not accept breaking up? Are they too serious too fast? Are they

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physically or sexually aggressive? If you answered yes to any of these questions you could be in a violent relationship.

Chelsea: At first it was a lot of name calling. It was a lot of “you’re gross or you’re ugly, or nobody likes you. I don’t like you.

Amanda: nmsafedate.info is a website you can visit to take a full relationship quiz and find out more about teen date violence. There are also local telephone numbers you can call listed in the resources section. Reporting from Las Cruces at Onate High School, this is Amanda Fretwell.

Sharenelle Sena: Thin is in and teen girls across the nation are buying into the image they see on tv, at the movies and in magazines. But while many girls are getting the image by exercising and eating the right foods, others may turn to more desperate measures. They develop eating disorders called anorexia and bulimia. But why?

Peggy Townsend, CHS school nurse: When anorexic and bulimic people see themselves in a mirror they see a very distorted image. They see themselves as fat, even if fat is not there. //

Sharnelle: But just how anorexics and bulimics choose to starve themselves is quite different.

Mary Hiebert, Carlsbad Medical Center Dietician: Anorexics are afraid to eat. They often at tiems will move the food around the plate to make ti look like they've had something to eat, and then cover it with a napkin. They also like to have warm liquids to drink because it helps to quench their hunger.

Bulimics will binge eat, got to the bathroom, turn on the water and purge their food or exercise to excess. //

Sharnelle: Warning signs for anorexia include: dropping weight to about 20% of normal, denies feeling hungry, exercising excessively, feeling fat and, withdraws from social activities. Bulimics: eat huge amounts of food but doesn't gain weight, uses laxatives or diuretics, and also withdraws from social activities.

Treatment includes psychotherapy, family therapy, and learning to eat right. From Carlsbad High School this is Shanelle Sena reporting.

On February 9th, 2006 the Washington Post reported that teenage girls already having caught up with their male counterparts and illegal drug abuse and alcohol consumption now have the dubious distinction in surpassing boys in smoking and in prescription drug abuse.

The past two years, in fact, more young women than men started using alcohol, marijuana and cigarettes according to government findings.

According to teachers.net about half of all unintended teen pregnancies occurs when one or both parties are under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Not a lot of girls know how to deal with peer pressure. I think a lot of people like to follow the crowd and do what their friends are doing. I personally just say that I don't want to do it if I don't want to do it////

Other girls drink because, yea, they have this desire to fit in with the crowd and desire to be accepted by others and I also think they do it because a lot of times they get hopeless and they stop caring.
